Friday at the Sportatorium is for sure, as is a Saturday card somewhere else in the Dallas area. Fort Worth probably Monday. Sunday, a card possible. If knowing exactly makes a difference in your plans, let me know and I'll call you as soon as I know. Otherwise, I'll let those coming know as soon as I find out, so you can tell us which ones you'll attend.

As we've got it planned now, we'll have an all-day open house bazaar at the hotel Saturday, inviting the Dallas fans. Those who want can set up displays, bring wrestling games to challenge others, bring photos to swap or share or anything else your mind can conceive (Betsey wants to do tarot readings, I've had people ask to see my rock & roll photos so I'll bring some). We'll have a VCR available so bring unusual or interesting videotapes (no Starrcade or Hulkamania vol 45 please!) Percy Pringle has said he'll be there with some stuff and the Freebirds merchandisers have expressed interest in being there.

Since we'll be at the Sportatorium the night before, we'll be in the perfect position to encourage those Dallas fans to come. Percy already has information about who's coming and will pump it in advance so the Texas fans will be expecting us. You might think about wearing shirts or baseball hats from your city or your local team, just to let 'em know where you're from. That Yankees jacket should make them good and mad!

The Rennion arena which is walking distance from the hotel will have the Ringling brothers Circus the whole time we're there. The Longhorn Country Music complex featuring a museum, restaurant and concert stage is not too far from our hotel. Of course, there are galleries, theatres, restaurants, museums- and if you want to do some driving, there is Six Flags Over Texas and the Wet 'n' Wild waterpark. There's even Fort Worth if you are really ambitious. But even if you do not drive, there is plenty within walking distance of the hotel. Hey, this ain't Birmingham!

John Lanigan mentioned that those of you who have AT & T Opportunity Calling can get a discount on Peidmont. Also, the Days Inn has a toll-free number which is 1-800-527-7606.

Also, if anyone is coming on their own but would rather share a room with someone to save money, please let me know and I'll get you in touch with each other. I know several people have mentioned this.

Can those of you who are definitely coming drop me a line and let me know? I'll need to send you info on the cards as soon as we have it as well as how we'll work out the cost of the barbeque. Bobby Heenan entered the ring prior to intermission and reiterated that he was on a roll after two victories (huh?) and expressed pleasure that he had an open contract and will take anybody on.
5. ROUGEAUS PIN BEES B-
Rougeaus showed subtle heel moves in this fairly good bout. End came when Jacques reversed the pin attempt and allowed Raymond to pin Brunzell. Exactly the same match as MSQ against The Young Stallions.
6. BRAVO PIN PATERA C-
Not a bad bout despite a few missed moves. Patera ought to learn how to abort some moves before they make him look silly. At least his punches are looking better and both these guys are giving us a better over all bout.
7. RANDY SAVAGE PIN TED DiBIASE B+
This bout was much better than last time but it still hasn't reached its potential. Virgil interferred as he held Randy so that Ted could cream him. Ted missed, hit Virgil and Randy grabbed Ted's trunks to roll him up for pin. Ted attacked Randy and tried to wear the belt but Randy came back to save the belt.

NOTES:

While Randy is getting himself pumped up (I hope its not drugs) he should teach Elizabeth how to eat again as she looks absolutely emaciated. As mentioned by Dave Meltzer, there is a real trend for heel wins and this card is no exception (babyface wins have been real dominant in L.A.). This is probably to build up the revenge matches for the summer and the pay-per-view cards also a trend towards less matches (the matches themselves are noticably longer) is apparent. This big question will be if the "Rockers" are going to be in the W.W.F. long enough to show up on July 15th. I think the success of the Fantastics prompted the move to get the Rockers and if they can get their act together they will be extremely successful.

Brett "The Hit" Man Hart DREW Bad News Brown in a 20 minute time limit match that went actually 16:16 (A-) Best match of the night. Bad News pearl-harbored Hart and the match took off. However, Hart had the upper hand until 5:43 when he got the boot to the face from Brown as Hart charged him. Bad News took some really loud falls on mat with his feet. Brown took over and they brawled in and out of the ring. The Irresistible One was yelling "Greaseball! Greaseball!" at Hart and cheered for Brown with exhortations of "Harlem! Harlem!". Referee Ken Jugan was trying to get Brown to refrain from choking Hart at 11:25 but Brown yelled "Don't worry about it!". Brown slammed Hart on the concrete floor around 13:01 and said "So you wanted my trophy, huh!" and started slapping him. Hart came to and gave Brown a piledriver at the bell. It was a super match with several 2 counts. This was the finest opening match I've seen in a long time and I then became dejected as I figure we would not see a better match this evening.

Steve Lombardi pinned Bill Dixon at 8:25 (D) Dixon is a local jobber who along with Jimmy "Stonewall" Jackson are used as fill-ins in case one of the scheduled performers is a no-show. Brady Boone was scheduled to appear and I was disappointed not to see him. Lombardi has now shaved his whole chest. Surprisingly, this match got a lot of heat as Steve made the match watchable. Lombardi is a real pro. At least, we were spared Jimmy Jackson. Probably the worst match I could envision would be Bill Dixon vs Jimmy Jackson. It would be so bad, one would not laugh but get angry.

The Bolsheviks beat The Killer Bees at 16:08 Boris Zhukov pinned B. Brian Blair. (C/) The crowd was really into this match with The Bees getting healthy cheers. The opening minutes were controlled by Blair over both Russians. Both Bees yanked at Zhukov's beard at 6:30. At 10:20 Volkoff started beating on Blair and the fans really got into this match with chants of "USA! USA!". Referee Rocky Palermo showed his stuff by kicking Volkoff's hands off the ring ropes and he then did his bellyflop dive to deliver a 2 count on big Nick as Brunzell yanked him down at 13:10. End came when The Bees took control and whipped both Russians into each other. However, Brunzell and Volkoff collided. As referee Palermo was pushing back Blair to his corner, Zhukov came off the ropes to pin Brunzell and he pushed Volkoff out of the ring.

The Ultimate Warrior pinned Hercules with his body press drop at 13:24. (C) Yes, it went over 13 minutes! This was the best match I have ever seen The Warrior participate. The Irresistible One was calling Warrior "Dingbat! Dingbat". I noticed several painted faces on the kids. At 4:40 Warrior chased Hercules around the ring and picked up the score's table and had it leaning on the ropes. Then, he picked up Hercules and threw him into the table. It was some of the best table antic's I've ever seen. Will Wonders never cease? The match waned as Hercules put Warrior in a bearhug at 8:39. At 10:58 they did a double-closetline and both laid on the mat for a minute. After 13 minutes, Warrior picked up Hercules and held him aloft for at least 7 seconds before dropping him for the pin.

For The WWF Tag Team Title, Strike Force beat Demolition, with manager Mr. Fuji at 16:16 by DQ. (B-) A good moving match. At 3:16 Ax delivered around 15 Ax handles on Martel and $\frac{1}{2}$ the fans cheered. Martel got tripped up by Ax coming off the ropes at 7:00 enabling Smash to put a nervehold on Martel. Ax came in to relieve Smash and Ax yelled at Tito Santana at the turnbuckles "Come on over here Taco!". Martel did a nice flying body press at 12:27 but fell out of the ring. Tito got the tag at 13:33 and cleaned house. At 14:01, Santana put the figure four on one of The Demolition and the referee became distracted. Fuji then entered the ring and hit Santana and hit Santana with his cane to get his team disqualified. I hope these teams continue to face each other in future matches.

For The WWF Inter-Continental Title. Honky Tonk Man, with manager Jimmy Hart "disguised" as Peggy Sue pinned Brutus "The Barber" Beefcake at 11:34. (C/) It was a so-so match but the crowd cheered wildly for Brutus and this match generated the most heat of the evening. I suppose it's a combination of the fans' dislike for my hero Honky and their liking of Brutus' barbering. "Peggy Sue" had a scarf around her face. Brutus took charge at the opening bell until 4:02 when he missed on a elbowdrop. Fans started yelling "Haircut! Haircut!" at 7:57 as Honky was beating on Beefcake. At 9:34 Honky put Brutus in a sleeper but Brutus got of it at 9:58. It was all Beefcake and when "Peggy Sue" came up to the ring, Beefcake grabbed her as she threw Honky a hairbrush out of her Purse. Honky smacked Beefcake on the head with it as the ref was restraining Beefcake from "Peggy Sue" to get the pin. Brutus got "Peggy Sue" and ripped off all her clothes to reveal Jimmy Hart clad only in his bikini briefs. Sorry, no photos as the mouth of the south is too fast for me. Hart should try out for the olympics.

For The WWF Championship Title, Randy "Macho Man" Savage with manager Elizabeth pinned Ted "The Million Dollar Man" DiBiase with valet Virgil with a scoop at 10:38 (B-) Savage was not wearing the belt as the ring announcer told all "that the belt was being repaired. I noticed a lot of 10 to 12 year old girls. I think they're into it because of Elizabeth. In fact one young miss was dressed up like Elizabeth. It was DiBiase for the opening minutes. Savage reversed a suplex on DiBiase at 5:46 to break the momentum. Best move of the night came when Savage leaps out of the ropes slingshotting DiBiase as DiBiase fell on his head and rolled over. At 9:01 DiBiase came off the ropes but Savage Slugged him in the belly and flipped over. DiBiase really dose fantastic bumps. End came when Virgil held onto Savage as DiBiase charged but Savage ducked and nailed Virgil to enable Savage to scoop up DiBiase for the pin. This championship match did not have the electricity that Hulk Hogan brings to the mat. Something's missing.

Dusty once again went to work on Windham. He gave Barry a very good D.DT. Luger chased Flair back to the dressing room and they were both counted out, outside of the ring.
