FOOD REPORT: The wrestling card, promoted by Great Lakes Wrestling Association, was held in conjunction with the Ohio Rib Burnoff at the Medina County Fairgrounds. What a lucky treat! There were at least 20 booths offering ribs, fried veggies, and other non-arena type goodies. I tried the \$1 sampler from Willy's Ribs first. It was a beef rib with a good tangy sauce but not much meat on the bone which is usually the case for beef ribs. Instead of venturing to every booth, I bought the \$5 dinner from RP Ribs which included a generous 4 rib pork slab, barbecued baked beans, Southern style cole slaw, and roll. I usually prefer pork ribs because there's a lot more meat. The pork was moist but I wish Willy's tangy sauce was on the ribs. RP's sauce was on the mild side and it was lukewarm. The baked beans were delicious and the cole slaw was fine with the Southern style addition of pickles. I love it when food festivals sponsor wrestling cards. At the souvenir stand, Jimmy Valiant and Kevin Von Erich were signing autographs and Michael Hayes had his record album for sale. I passed and spent the time talking with Miss Kitty and Anastasia Fantsios of Cleveland. It was nice to see Cleveland's best-looking fans. Now, promoted by the Great Lakes Wrestling Association, onto "The World Series of Championship Wrestling '88" matches:

(1) THE DEMON OF DARKNESS pinned PEDRO PEREZ with a suplex at 6:39.

* (D) * Both these guys seemed green and the Demon should be a hillbilly rather than a masked type with his stocky build.

(2) PSYCHO MIKE pinned CRUSHER KLEBANSKI with manager MARK CURTIS at 11:08 to win the coveted North American Championship belt from the Crusher. * (D+) * Wow! Another major title change I have witnessed. I honestly think the promoter gave the belt to the Crusher before the matches. There was lots of clowning by all in the opening minutes with Curtis getting the fans riled up. It was mostly power stuff by Crusher doing elbow drops and bear hugs until Mike slammed Crusher at 8:33 which is a feat. Psycho Mike gave Crusher a mean right cross that Ron Garvin would have been proud of to gain the belt.

(3) BUTCH CASSIDY pinned the masked LITTLE BAD JOHN at 7:34 with a slam. * (C+) * I really enjoyed this midget bout as both exchanged lots of wrestling holds for the first three minutes. At 3:33 Butch did a sunset flip on the ref and Little Bad John counted three for the pin. Cassidy should have been the bad guy as Little Bad John played it straight. Cassidy delivered a nice drop kick at 5:01 and gave Little Bad John a backbreaker into a shoulder breaker at 5:49. Lots of clean wrestling action in this match.

(4) For the AWA World Belt, MADUSA MACELI vs THE FABULOUS MOOLAH with manager SAM SIEGAL went to a *double disqualification* at 14:02. * (B) *

Best match of the night. Yes, this DDQ was outstanding as it was suprising. There were two refs for this bout. This was no silly cat fight. These two gals brawled all around the ring. Both were heels but Madusa was cheered heavily. Both exchanged arm locks and pulled each other's hair and tights until Moolah slammed Madusa at 5:38. Moolah threw Madusa out hard onto the scorers' table as announcer, former WWF mouthpiece Jack Reynolds had a stunned look as Madusa ended up in his lap. Madusa was then taunted by Siegal who got sluggish down by Madusa at 8:11. Madusa then threw Moolah out of the ring at 10:03. The two then brawled outside the ring and shoved both refs around. Madusa then gave Moolah an airplane spin for at least 30 seconds before depositing Moolah on the scorers' table. End came when both refs were trying to restrain the ladies who then beat up the refs to get disqualified. I wish Dave Meltzer would have seen this match as he would have been as shocked as much as myself. I got a big thrill as I got my picture taken with Madusa and shook Moolah's hand.

(5) HOWARD "THE ANIMAL" STEELE pinned Russian VLADIMIR MARKOFF with manager Sam Siegal at 13:38 with a body press. * (D) * The ring doctor checked out Steele at 9:13 after Siegal bit Steele. End came when Siegal threw fire and mistakenly hit his man Markoff. Howard slammed Markoff for the winning pin.

(6) KAMALA, with manager SAM SIEGAL, pinned HANDSOME JIMMY VALIANT with a splash at 8:02. * (C-) * I'm calling the Boogie-Woogie Man handsome again because he shaved his beard off and is only sporting a moustache now. Jimmy grabbed the mike and said: "Hey Kamala, Your Momma!" and then kissed a lady fan. Kamala started chopping Valiant down at 5:02 and had a nerve hold on Valiant's arm pit for a couple of minutes. Siegal was late in interfering as Kamala finished off Jimmy before he could fully recover.

(7) MICHAEL HAYES & KEVIN VON ERICH beat THE ORIGINAL SPOILER and EXOTIC ADRIAN STREET with MISS LINDA in a best two out of 3 Fall matchup. * (C) * In the first fall, STREET pinned Hayes at 3:52 with Micheal Hayes' foot on the ropes. Adrian kissed and goosed the ref and did a great job getting doubleteamed by Kevin and Hayes. Spoiler interfered to give Street the advantage. Adrian was outside the ring and came up over the ropes to pin Hayes. Street was tremendous tonight. The second fall went to Hayes and Von Erich. Hayes gave Spoiler a big slam at 1:23 to pop the crowd. Miss Linda hit her man Street by mistake with her purse to enable HAYES to elbow drop and pin Street at 3:20. The third fall was mostly Kevin against the Spoiler. The match broke down as Spoiler got rammed into the turnbuckle by Kevin. Hayes and Street got into it as the Spoiler got counted out of the ring battling Kevin to give Hayes and Von Erich the victory. Michael Hayes is a much better tag performer than single wrestler as he can get the fans charged up.

(8) For the AWA World Title, JERRY "THE KING" LAWLER pinned WAHOO McDANIEL at 14:48. * (C) * Lawler was the bad guy here because he

grabbed the mike and said that he lived in nearby Lorain, Ohio for 7 years and was very upset that the mayor was not here to present him with a plaque or the keys to the city. Lawler was a coward for most of the match claiming that Wahoo was always grabbing his hair. Wahoo was getting real mad and finally got Lawler in a arm lock at 6:48 and chopped on Lawler for several minutes with the fans going wild for Wahoo. Lawler took over at 10:12 with his fist drop and Wahoo began to bleed at 11:12. Wahoo recovered and chopped on Lawler and even got a couple of two counts on the King. End came when both collided into each other off the ropes and Lawler fell on top of Wahoo to get the pin.

NOTES & STUFF: All the big name wrestlers that were billed as coming showed up so this card was quite interesting. Madusa was very nice but I think Dark Journey, Elizabeth, Missy Hyatt and Precious are a tad better looking but Madusa is best performer. Madusa said that the big Pay-Per-View show from the AWA will not be on Election Night because even us wrestling fans would probably prefer to see who is going to be our next President than next wrestling world champion. My rumor of One Man Gang quitting the WWF is false as he is scheduled to be in the main event in Johnstown, PA on 9/9/88 against Hacksaw Duggan. It appears that Dusty Rhodes is in big trouble with the law in Las Vegas, Nevada. Dusty was arrested for drunk driving in Las Vegas with an open bottle of Jack Daniels during the Bash last month and the police filed several other charges because he gave them a hard time. Last week he and his lawyer failed to appear for their preliminary hearing and the judge became very upset and this may prove to be quite distressing for Dusty. I really don't know if the authorities will want to extradite Dusty from North Carolina for his trial, as it is not a serious crime, so to speak. After the matches, we went to O'Malleys, part of the Quality Inn, near the Cleveland airport with the local wrestlers. Only Wahoo of the bigname wrestlers was there and I was told to stay away from him as he likes to be alone. I did because I had on my Jerry Lawler T-shirt! It was great dancing and being with Miss Kitty and Anastasia for the rest of the evening. Thanks, ladies, and the group was good. Miss Kitty executed her own style of "detente" as she and the Russian Vladimir enjoyed each other's company. Gee! First it was Jonathan Boyd and now the Russian. Maybe I should shave my head bald on my next trip to Cleveland! Ha! Ha! Anastasia is hoping that some of the group from New Jersey and New York besides Pittsburgh can come up for the Survivors on Thanksgiving. I've been told that the NWA Pro Wrestling show is being taken off the air in Pittsburgh next week. Thank God for cable because I wouldn't be able to see any wrestling as Pittsburgh is about the worst TV town for wrestling that I know of. The promoter here is hoping for another big show in the Cleveland area in October with Madusa against Wendi Richter. My tentative line-up of upcoming shows:

Ron Simmons W. Agent Steel (Steel started to attack Ron, by working on his back. Ron gave him a good take down. Ron, finally, executed a flying shoulder block and hooked Agent's leg and pinned him. This match took under two min. and gets a three.)

Ricky Morton W. Curtis Thompson (Curtis executed two good hip tosses. Curtis started to punch Morton in the chest and then body slammed him twice. Morton D.Dted Curtis and executed a flying body press and then hooked the legs and pinned him. The match took about four min. was not to bad and gets a 7.)

The Fantastics (Bobby Fulton & Tommy Rogers) and Brad Armstrong W. Ric Steiner & Larry Zbyszko & Al Perez (They started to chant "Larry Stinks". Larry said that Philadelphia stinks. Perez and Armstrong started things off. Fulton came in and hip-rolled Perez off the ropes twice. Fulton gave Perez and Steiner a double head scissors. Perez tried a flying elbow, but missed when Rogers moved out of the way. Perez gave Rogers a flying clothesline. Steiner threw Rogers over the top rope and body slammed him into the steel gate, that seperates the fans from the ring area. Armstrong gave Larry a Russian leg sweep. Fulton executed a suplex and a good leg drop. Armstrong came off the top rope with a sunset flip and then small packaged cradled Zbyszko for the pin. This match gets an 8.)

The Road Warriors (Animal & Hawk) W. The Russian Assassin & Rip Morgan (The Assassin and Rip Morgan came out with Paul Jones and The Warriors came out with Precious Paul Ellering. Hawk gave Morgan a flying dropkick and he also gave The Assassin a flying shoulder block. Animal double dropkicked his opponent and then clotheslined Morgan. Rip started to stomp on Hawks back and head area. The Russian body slammed Hawk and then put him in a bear-hug. Animal gave Morgan a flying dropkick and picked him up. Hawk came off the top rope and gave Morgan a flying clothesline. Animal, then, pinned Morgan. During the match Ivan Koloff came out and punched Paul Jones. The Russian Assassin let Koloff have it. This match gets a 9.)

Mike Rotundo W. Nikita Koloff -DQ. (Mike came to the ring with Kevin Sullivan. The fans started to chant "Nikita Nikita". Mike Executed a tremendous body slam and a good hip-toss. Nikita executed a very good back body drop. Rotundo ducked and caught Nikita and flung him out of the ring. Sullivan, then used the spike on Nikita's throat, by hitting him with it about five times. Nikita tried to pin Rotundo with a small package cradle, but no luck. Rotundo clotheslined Nikita. During the match, the fans kept up their chant of "Nikita Nikita". Koloff executed a flying clothesline and pinned Rotundo. The referee got up and saw that Mike's foot was under the ropes. He, then, said that the match should continue. Nikita went berzerk by that decision and flipped Mike over the top rope. The referee, disqualified Nikita and awarded the decision to Mike. This match gets a 8.)

Dusty Rhodes W. Kevin Sullivan (Dog Collar Chain Match) Dusty was bleeding as well as Sullivan. Al Perez was tied to Brad Armstrong, so he could not interfere. The rules are when either one gets knocked down to the mat, the referee starts to count. If the person who is knocked down dose not get up, by the ten count, then, his opponent wins. Rhodes, finally, won. After the match Paul Jones came out and let Rhodes have it. Perez, also, let Armstrong have it.)

Sting W. Barry Windham -DQ. (Windham came out with Dillon. Sting executed a flying body press. Sting keeps improving with age, like a bottle of wine. Sting executed a shoulder block, dropkick, and rammed Windham's head into the mat. Windham executed an atomic drop and body slam. Windham tried to ram his back into Sting, but The Stinger moved out of the way. Barry, then, fell

out of the ring. They started to slap each other. Barry threw Sting out of the ring. Sting suplexed Windham and back flipped him into the ring. Sting climbed to the top rope and descended on Windham with a flying clothesline. The referee, finally, disqualified Barry because he had the claw hold on Sting. He was on the outside ring apron and then came into the ring, still with the clawhold on Sting. Barry refused to let go and was, then, disqualified. This match gets a ten.)

SEMI - MAIN EVENT

The Midnight Express (Bobby Eaton & Stan Lane) W. Tully Blanchard & Arn Anderson (The Express were cheered. Cornett came to the ring with The Express and Dillon came out with Blanchard and Anderson. Cornett told Dillon to come into the ring and show the fans how much he looks like the comedian, Foster Brooks. Dillon told Cornett, "why do you carry a tennis racquet if you have no balls". Lane double clotheslined his opponent's. Lane gave Anderson a karate kick to the stomach and back. The Express double clotheslined Blanchard. Anderson gave a karate chop to Lane's back and a D.Dt. Anderson punched Lane in the stomach. Blanchard kicked Lane in the stomach, that sent him out of the ring. Eaton executed a flying dropkick on Anderson. The Express were making mince meat out of their opponents. Anderson executed a gord buster and Eaton rammed Anderson's head into the mat. Larry executed a suplex and a Russian leg sweep on Tully. Eaton pinned Arn with a flying leg drop. Tully, also was pinning Lane, but Tully and Lane were not the legal men in the ring. The referee took the pin count of both together. The referee told the ring announcer that The Express won the match and The Worlds Tag Title, because Eaton pinned Arn. They were the two legal men in the ring. Blanchard, Anderson and Dillon complained, but the decision stood. This match gets a ten.)

MAIN EVENT

Lex Luger W. Ric Flair -DQ. (Ric Flair is The National Alliance Heaveyweight Champion. Former football great John Ayers, who played for The San Francisco 49ers, was designated as the special referee. Luger came to the ring to alot of cheers. Flair came out with his manager James J. Dillon. Luger executed a power body slam. Flair, then, left for the dressing room. Luger went after him and carried Flair back into the ring. Luger punched Flair in the head a couple of times and suplexed him. Ric tried to let John Ayers have it, but the referee punched Flair down and showed him who was the boss in the ring. Flair gave Lex a knee to the throat. Luger clotheslined Flair. Ric executed the figure four leg lock, but John told Flair to release the hold, because he held on to the ropes for leverage. Ric refused and Ayers picked him up. Luger tried a dropkick and missed. Flair threw Luger over the top rope, but the referee didn't see it. Luger rammed Flair's head into the ring post. Flair was bleeding. Luger punched Flair in the head. Windham tried to interfere, but it didn't work, because gave him a shoulder block, While the referee was busy with Windham, Dillon came to the ring. Luger had Flair over his shoulder and Dillon hit him with the shoe. As Dillon hit Luger with the shoe, Ayers turned around and saw what happened and disqualified Flair, because of Dillon's action. This match gets a ten.)

1. Terry Taylor PIN B. Brian Blair C+

Good workmanlike bout and not bad for an opener. Brian even did the old hide under the mat and get your opponent from behind routine. Highlite was a good flying press from the top rope by Blair. The pinning attempt was reversed, however (not very smoothly) and got Terry the pin.

2. Blue Blazer PIN Scott Casey C+

Scott Casey was booed at the introduction. I believe he was really surprised at this because he hadn't even begun to apply his rusty heel moves. Owen really made an impression last time out and it carried over. The bout wasn't near as good as last time but still better than most. Would have been graded higher but the finish was botched. I'm not sure who's fault it was. It was a reverse rolling pin from the top rope with a high difficulty level. It would have been quite impressive if done properly.

3. Chico Santana DRAW Hercules C-

What kept me occupied during this bout was that these guys were wearing the same boots. They were white with a red lightening bolt. Herc had a black hand holding it and Chico didn't. I could make it out so it kept me occupied most of the match. The end came when Ref. Jesse Hernandez, out of no where, called a halt to the match and called it a draw. No explanation, no bell, and Lord knows it didn't go 20 minutes. Chico took the mike and said that "The Ref wasn't doing his job, lets have 5 minues with no Ref." Herc wanted no part of it and left.

4. Randy Savage DQ Andre The Giant C-

Before the match, Macho Man had a talk with Jay Strongbow and expressed his feeling that Heenan should not be allowed ringside. Heenan said fine but Lizzie should leave also. Elizabeth refused to leave Macho Man so Bobby was allowed to stay but he had to sit at a table with orders not to get up, or he have to leave. Ref. Dave Hebner (looked more like Earl to me) spent a lot of time keeping Liz away from her fallen hero. Andre was getting tied up in the ropes down pat and when he did it this time, the crowd really popped. Later, Bobby Heenan interferred by holding on to Savage in an effort to save Andre. High grade for crowd heat.

5. Bad News Brown PIN Junkyard Dog D+

Bad News won this one with what else, the Ghetto Blaster/Enzuigiri. JYD sold it to the max and Allen got the pin. As he was leaving, Bad News said "No one survives the Ghetto Blaster." JYD made this a pretty bad match.
