Skinner & Barry Horowitz

Owen let Skinner have it by hitting him in the back with his shirt, while the referee was giving Skinner his instructions. The bell sounded for the match to begin and Koko and Horowitz were the first in the ring. Barry headbutted Koko in the stomach ans Koko threw Barry's head first into the mat floor. Skinner hip tossed Koko twice. Skinner climbed the ropes and put his hands up to the fans. Koko hip tossed Skinner and Barry. Owen entered the ring and slapped Barry in the chest area. Barry tried to ram himself into Owen, but Owen caught him and executed a nice hip toss. Barry tried to ram himself into Owen again, but Owen moved out of the way and Barry landed into the turnbuckle. Skinner and Barry had **Owen** in a head lock. Owen clotheslined Barry and Barry executed a leg drop to Koko's throat/chest area. Skinner came off the top rope with a flying elbow. Koko double clotheslined his opponents. Owen head-butted his opponents heads together. Koko, finally, pinned Barry, by coming off the top rope with a flying dropkick. After the match Skinner and Barry Started to have words, but they then hugged and left the ring.

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH:
This match had good action and was a good oponer. Both teams worked well together in mat combat. This match gets an 8.

(2) Shawn Michaels defeated Virgil (shawn came to the ring with Sensational Sherry. Sherry had a heart shapped mirror with her. Sherry took off Shawn's attire. She had a heart shape thing attached to her back. She was at ring-side during the match. Virgil dropped kicked Shawn out of the ring. Virgil chased Sherry and tossed Shawn into the ring. Shawn pushed and slapped Virgil in the chest. Virgil tried for a flying body press pin, but no luck. Shawn tried for a pin, but no luck. Shawn hip tossed Virgil and gave Virgil a knee to the stomach. Sharry started to bang her hands on the mat floor, while Shawn was on the mat floor. Virgil tried for a pin, off the middle rope, but no luck. Shawn, then, pinned Virgil by hooking the legs.)

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH:
This match had good action. Both men looked good in the ring. This match gets an 8.

Razor Ramon came out to speak. He told everybody to listen to what he had to say. He told the fans that Randy Savage hurt his leg at Summer Slam and to take a look at him. Ramon has two good legs. Randy Savage is like all you fans, he is "el Stupido" Randy Savage will come to the ring limping and he said "I will break your good leg like a tooth pick" Razor fought Savage latter on in the evening.

(3) The Mountie defeated El Maditor (Tito Santana) (The Mountie came out Singing. He told them to stop the music. He asked the New York Hillbillies if you know, who I am. Santana used two good clotheslines. The Mountie punched Santana in the head several times. The Mountie started to kick Santana in the stomach with his boot and Tito kicked The Mountie in the thigh. The Mountie executed a good pile driver. The Mountie grabbed the mike and yelled "I'm The Mountie". The Mountie thought that Tito was still on the mat floor. He turned around and Santana hip tossed him. Santana started to work on The Mountie. He dropped kicked and punched The Mountie out of the ring. The Mountie finally pinned Santana. Santana had his feet on the ropes, but the referee didn't see it. The Mountie tried to use the stick on Santana, but no luck. Santana grabbed the stick and went after The Mountie.)

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH:
This match had some good action, towards the middle and end of the match.
The begining had alot of stalling. This match gets a 7.

(4) Razor Ramon defeated Randy "Macho Man" Savage. (The Macho Man yelled "Oh Yeah". Ramon took his time coming to the ring. The referee had to keep Savage from getting at Ramon before the sound of the bell. The bell finally sounded and Razor shoved Savage. Savage raised his hands and the fans went wild. Ramon pushed Randy into the turnbuckle. Randy clotheslined Razor and attacked him from the back. Ramon chocked Randy with the top ring rope. Randy tossed Razor out of the ring. The both started to fight on the arena floor. Razor kicked Savage in the rear end. Randy used an arm drag and sent Ramon out of the ring. Ramon tried for a figure four, but Randy was able to kick out. He kicked Randy in the rear end, sending him out of the ring. Randy executed a good body slam. Randy tried to come off the top rope, but Ric Flair came out to interferee. Randy chased Flair around the arena floor. Flair gave Ramon his championship belt and then started to distract the referee. The referee did not see Flair hand Ramon the belt. Ramon then used the belt on Randy. Randy fell to the mat floor. The referee then turned around and saw Ramon on top of Randy and Ramon pinned him.)

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH: This match was excellent and had super action, from start to finish. This match gets a 10.

(5) The Natural Disasters defeated The Beverly Brothers. (Tugboat clotheslined one of his opponents and then tried for a pin, but no luck. One of The Beverly Brothers started to kick Tugboat in the back and then came off the top rope, with a flying elbow. One of the Beverly Brothers came off the top rope and typhoon moved out of the way. Earthquake body slammed one of his opponents to the mat floor and then jumped on top of him and pinned him.)

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH:
This match was to short. This contest gets a 7.

(6) Brett "The Hitman" Hart defeated Papa Shango (Papa Shango came out in his weird outfit and carried something that had smoke in it. Shango is quite strange, to say the least. Shango came after Brett even before he came to the ring. Brett tried to ram Shango, but Shango caught him in a bearning. Brett punched Shango in the stomach, several times. Shango clothes lined Brett. Brett tried to pin Shango, but no luck. Shango raised his hands and the fans booed. Shango used a flying elbow on Hart. Shango came off the top rope and Hart moved out of the way. Shango tried to pin Brett three times, but no luck. Brett hit Shango in the head about ten times. Brett, finally, snuck up behind Shango and grabbed him. He took Shango down and cradled pin him, for the win.)

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH:
This match had good action and gets an 8.

(7) The Undertaker defeated Ric "Nature Boy" Flair -DQ. (The Undertaker came out with his manager Paul Bearer. He was annouced from Death Valley. Bearer was carring the urn. Flair came to the ring with his consultant, Mr. Perfect. Flair showed off his world belt. Flair and Perfect possed for the cramers. Flair pushed The Undertaker, which had little effect on him. The Undertaker pushed Flair to the mat floor. The Undertaker chased Flair around the ring area. Flair racked The Unertakers eyes. Flair started to beg for mercy. He slapped The Undertaker, but it had no effect

on his opponent. Flair argued with the referee, while Mr. Perfect attacked The Undertaker on the arena floor. Flair came off the top rope with a flying elbow. Flair body slammed The Undertaker. The Undertaker gave Flair a good suplex. Flair, then, punched The Undertaker in the throat. The Undertaker fell to the mat floor, from this action. The Undertaker reversed Flair's figure four leg lock and then body slammed Flair. He tried to pin Ric, but Flair kicked out. Flair climbed to the top rope. The Undertaker grabbed Flair and tossed him to the mat floor and executed a very good milatary press. The Undertaker was in the proces of pinning Flair. Mr Berfect came into the ring with a chair and used it on The Undertaker's back. The referee saw this action and promptly discussified Pic Flair for Mr. Perfect's setion qualified Ric Flair for Mr. Perfect's action.

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE MATCH:

Both wrestlers looked very good in mat action. This match had excellent action from start to finish. I am very very happy to see Ric Flair with the world championship. I take nothing away from the Matcho Man. I saw the match between Ric Flair and The Macho Man. That match was fantastic. The above match with Flair and The Undertaker gets a 10.

COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE CARD: This card had good action. This card gets an 8-1/2.

- (1) Dustin Rhodes defeated Vinnie Vegas (By pin with a bulldog
- (2) Van Hammer defeated Diamond Dallas Paige (By pin, with a reverse cradle.)
- (3) Eric Watts defeated Mean Mark Canterburry (By pin, with a drop arm drag.)
- (4) The Steiner Brothers defeated Dick Slater & Greg Valentine (Ric pinned Greg with the use of a clothesline.)
- The first four matches i didn't see. Good Friend John H. Lanigan who was sitting with me, filled me in on the endings of the first four matches.
- (5) Ricky Steamboat defeated The Super Invader (Steamboat hip tossed and dropkicked his opponents. The Invader tried to ram Steamboat's head into the turnbuckle, but no luck. Steamboat executed a good leap frog. The Invader tried to pin Steamboat, with a flying leg drop, but no luck. The Super Invader used a nice bearhug. Steamboat kicked his opponents in the stomach. The Super Invader tried for a flying body press pin, but no luck. Steamboat tried for a cradle pin, but no luck. The Super Invader kicked out sending himm into Harley Race who was on the outside ring apronacky finally pinned The Super Invader by hooking the legs with a flying body press.)
- (6) Sting & Nikita Koloff defeated Rick Rude & Jake Roberts -DQ. (koloff and Rude started things off. Koloff kicked Rude. Sting hip tossed Rude and had him in a chin lock. Jake threw Sting to the mat floor. Sting threw Rude head first into the mat fkoor. Nikita went at with Jake. Jake shoved Nikita's head into the turnbuckle several times. Jake executed an elbow to Nikita's chest/throat area. Rude body slammed Nikita. Rude had Nikita in a good chin lock. Sting came in and let both of his opponents have it. Sting tried to pin Jake, but no luck. Nikita and Sting, finally, won by disqualification, because Madusa interfereed.)
- (7) The Barbarian W. Barry Windham (The Barbarian clotheslined Windham to the mat floor. He started to punch Barry in the chest area. Barry tried to pin The Barbarian with a flying clothesline, but no luck. The Barbarian pinned Barry with a knee to the stomach.)
- (8) Dr. Death Steve Williams and Terry Gordy defeated Arn Anderson and Bobby Eaton ( Terry Gordy clotheslined Anderson. Dr. Death milatary pressed Anderson. Dr. Death pushed Anderson's legs in between the ropes. Bobby Eaton tried to pin Gordy, but no luck. Bobby came off the top rope and Gordy moved out of the way. Dr. Death executed a back body drop and drop kick. Dr. Death tried to pin Bobby, but no luck. Dr. Death finally pinned Bobby Eaton.)
- (9) Ron Simmons defeated Steve Austin (Simmons executed a good back body drop. Simmons started to punch Austin in the back. Simmons used a foot to the stomach and a Boston Crab. Austin tried to pin Simmons, but no luck. Simmons, finally, body slammed Austin and then pinned him.)

FOOD REPORT: My longing for a trip to see my beloved WWF here because of the delicious food made for an exceptional evening. The \$1 hot dogs were wonderful morsels, well-cooked and the buns were fresh and warmed. The diced onions were cooked to a light brown to complement the weiners. My only complaint was the dog seemed to have gotten smaller since May of 1991. The \$1.50 nachos were not plentiful but the chips were crisp and fresh although they lacked any warmth. Macho Mania was prevalent with horrible \$8 Macho Man finger sponges but the \$5 colorful bandana looked like a wonderful addition to any wrestling fan's wardrobe. - (1) <u>FL. MATADOR</u> pinned THE MOUNTIE at 12:00 with the flying forearm. # (C) # We got a kick watching the ring attendant, Eugene Palermo, saluting the Mountie as he entered the ring. Good comedy stuff by the Mountie claiming cheap shots by Santana after which he yanked on Tito's ponytail. Mountie did a 360° from a punch to the stomach by Tito at 11:39.
- (2) **LATURAL DISASTERS** beat DOUBLE TROUBLE at 9:06 to retain the WWF Tag Title. **EARTHQUAKE** pinned the smaller brother from the Bronx with his sitdown splash. \* (C-) \* Ref Bill Alfonso looked out of place with all the tubbies in the ring. Steve commented that Double Trouble would be interesting opponents for the Bushwhackers. The Bronx fatboys worked on Typhoon's leg most of the match until Earthquake got the hot tag and delivered a nifty dropkick on the big DT before he pinned the little brother. Steve caught Alfonso's attention after the match and Alfonso told him that El Gigante WWF bound and has lost close to 40 pounds.
- (3) RAZOR RANON beat RANDY SAVAGE by <u>COR</u> at 9:14. # (C+) # Savage looked to have experienced a hair transplant or weave recently. Savage slapped the toothpick out of Ramon's mouth at 1:35 to start the match.

Savage sold his knee injury throughout the match and Ramon did some decent flying bumps and even got slammed by the Macho Man at 8:30. Savage nailed Ramon with a double ax handle from the top turnbuckle onto the outside mat but was unable to beat the count into the ring which Ramon did to win the contest.

- (4) SHAVE MICHAELS with SENSATIONAL SHERRI pinned VIRGIL with a leg thrust at 12:51. \* (B-) \* Best match on the card. A Black guy was hassling Michaels who retorted with: "Get to the back of the bus! Slave!" First lockup took place at 3:29 which hurt the match considerably as both guys finally went to town. A very nice dropkick by Virgil at 4:59 sent Michaels flying out of the ring. Michaels has become one of the premier spitters. Good heat developed when Virgil got out of a headlock and delivered a neckbreaker at 11:27. Fast moving bout after the initial stall.
- (5) HIGH EMERGY beat SKINNER and Steve's favorite grappler, BARRY HOROWITZ, at 16:02. KOKO B. WARE pinned HOROWITZ with a dropkick from the top turnbuckle. \* (C+) \* Owen Hart executed no flying moves at all but did some nice armlock exchanges with Horowitz around the 4:00 mark. Line of the night was a fan behinfd me yelling: "Hey Barry! Go back to Global!" Skinner yelled at Steve: "Ny sister's bigger than you!" and Steve came back with: "You ought to know! You slept with her last night!" Koko landed on his feet after delivering his winning move from the top turnbuckle.

(6) BRET HART pinned PAPA SHANGO at 8:14 with a schoolboy. \* (D) \* Very poor match for a finale. Hart gave his shades to a little girl when Shango decked him from behind. It was too close a call as the girl could have been hurt. Shango put on a lengthy nerve hold and the crowd went to sleep. Hart must have took the night off as it was Shango doing elbow drops until he missed one from the middle ropes to set up the schoolboy.

NOTES & STUFF: Sorry, there was no report from John Arezzi's New York City convention because I did not attend the wrestling show due to the venue being close to 3 hours away. The highlight for me was finally meeting good friends Jeff Cohen and Sheldon Goldberg for the first time and renewing friendships with Kenny Levitt, Marty Gorman, Paul Frank, Joel Manison, Nike Schwamm, Teddy Siegle, Vinnie Carolan, and good buddy Scotty Dickinson. There was tons of stuff to buy and many photo opportunities were made available with all the wrestlers at hand. I hope John pulls off another one next year. I got to visit Ellis Island, Wall Street, Chinatown, and Coney Island thanks to Kenny's hospitality. I have decided to give my camera a break for a few months. It was getting to be too much taking photos, doing the reports and making tapes.
